

# A WORD FROM OUR CHIEF, 22 YEARS OF EXPERIENCE



IN 2017 THE POLICE DEPARTMENT WAS IN A STEADY HIRING PROCESS FILLING VACANCIES CREATED BY STAFF WHO LEFT AT THE END OF 2015 AND CONTINUED INTO 2016. SOME OFFICERS LEFT FOR EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES WITH AGENCIES OUTSIDE THE AREA WHILE THE LINE OF DUTY DEATH OF SGT. GOODDING AND THE RETIREMENT OF A LONG TENURED LIEUTENANT ALL CONTRIBUTED TO THE NEED TO HIRE NEW STAFF. IN 2016 WE WERE ABLE TO HIRE FOUR OFFICERS WITH THE REMAINDER OF THE FINAL VACANCIES BEING FILLED IN 2017 AND EARLY 2018. ONE OF THE VACANT POSITIONS WAS A PATROL SUPERVISOR AND IN APRIL 2017 SGT. JOSH GREGORY STARTED WITH OUR DEPARTMENT AFTER WORKING FOR SEVERAL YEARS WITH THE CANNON BEACH POLICE DEPARTMENT. WE ARE FULLY STAFFED IN PATROL, WITH ONE OFFICER CURRENTLY ATTENDING THE POLICE ACADEMY AND WHO SHOULD BE SOLO BY THE END OF SUMMER OR EARLY FALL. THE HIRING PROCESS WAS NOT LIMITED TO PATROL, OUR DISPATCH CENTER WAS IN NEED OF ONE DISPATCHER UNTIL THE UNEXPECTED RESIGNATION OF THE COMMUNICATIONS MANAGER IN OCTOBER OF 2017 CREATING A SECOND VACANCY IN DISPATCH. THIS SUPERVISORY ROLE WAS QUICKLY REPLACED BY AN INTERNAL PROMOTION OF MITCH BROWN WHO STARTED WORK AS THE COMMUNICATIONS MANAGER IN LATE 2017. WE HAVE HIRED ONE OF THE VACANT DISPATCHER POSITIONS AND WE ARE IN THE PROCESS OF COMPLETING THE HIRING PROCESS FOR THE FINAL DISPATCHER

I MENTIONED LAST YEAR THAT WE WERE IN THE PROCESS OF CHANGING HOW WE PROCESS OUR CRIME REPORTING. WE ARE WORKING IN THE NIBRS (NATIONAL INCIDENT BASED REPORTING SYSTEM) TO REPORT OUR CRIMES AND THERE CONTINUES TO BE SOME CHALLENGES AS WE NAVIGATE THIS NEW SYSTEM. AS WE REVIEW OUR REPORTABLE CRIME STATISTICS YOU WILL SEE A FEW AREAS WHERE SPIKES IN THE REPORTED CRIME HAS INCREASED. SOME OF THIS CHANGE COULD BE DUE TO THE WAY IN WHICH OUR REPORTING CRITERIA IS DEFINED COMPARED TO OUR PREVIOUS REPORT SYSTEM.

AS WE CONTINUE INTO THE 2018 CALENDAR YEAR AND THE MORE ACTIVE SEASONAL PEAK THAT WE SEE DURING THE SPRING AND SUMMER THE POLICE DEPARTMENT IS PREPARED TO SERVE THE COMMUNITY PROVIDING QUALITY PUBLIC SAFETY TO OUR CITIZENS AND GUESTS WHO VISIT SEASIDE. WE CONTINUE TO WORK ON EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS AND OUR RESPONSE TO THE HAZARDS THAT ARE PRESENTED. OUR COMMUNITY OUTREACH AND INVOLVEMENT EFFORTS ARE INCREASING AND WE CONTINUE TO STRIVE TO MEET OUR MISSION TO PROVIDE THE COMMUNITY WITH SAFETY AND SECURITY THROUGH THE HIGHEST LEVEL OF PROFESSIONALISM, ETHICAL, AND INTEGRITY BASED SERVICES.

# A WORD FROM OUR LIEUTENANT, 34 YEARS OF EXPERIENCE



- DURING THE YEAR OF 2017, THE CITY OF SEASIDE AND THE SEASIDE POLICE DEPARTMENT CONTINUED TO GROW AND HEAL FROM THE EVENTS OF FEBRUARY 2016. THE GROWTH INCLUDED SEVERAL NEW FACES BEING BROUGHT INTO OUR RANKS AND WHO ARE NOW BEGINNING THEIR YOUNG CAREERS IN LAW ENFORCEMENT.
- AS FOR THOSE WHO HAD THE PRIVILEGE TO KNOW AND WORK WITH SGT. JASON GOODDING, HIS LOSS IS STILL FELT. BUT FOR THOSE SAME FEW STAFF MEMBERS, HEALING CONTINUES. IT SHALL BE THE GOAL OF OUR CURRENT STAFF TO PAUSE AT LEAST ANNUALLY TO REFLECT AND REMEMBER THE LIFE AND LEGACY LEFT BY SGT. GOODDING.
- THE SEASIDE POLICE DEPARTMENT WOULD LIKE TO EXTEND A HEARTY THANK YOU TO THE MEMBERS OF OUR COMMUNITY WHO CONTINUE TO STAND WITH US AND SUPPORT OUR EFFORTS. THIS IS RECOGNIZED BY THOSE WHO DO A GREAT JOB IN SERVICE TO OUR COMMUNITY EVEN WHEN AROUND THE COUNTRY, ISSUES ARISE WITH LAW ENFORCEMENT THAT SOMETIMES RAISE CONCERNS. OUR OFFICERS SHOULD CONTINUE TO BE SAFETY ORIENTED BUT APPROACHABLE BY THOSE THEY ARE SWORN TO SERVE AND PROTECT. WITH THAT, A GREATER SENSE OF COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT AND PARTICIPATION IN EVENTS WILL FOSTER A CLOSER WORKING RELATIONSHIP OUTSIDE OF THE CALLS FOR SERVICE. THIS TEAM WORK WILL HELP BRING ABOUT POSITIVE CHANGE.
- OUR DEPARTMENT HAS ALSO CONTINUED TO WORK ON A TEAM ORIENTED APPROACH TO SHIFT WORK. THIS FIRST STARTED ON THE PATROL SIDE, BUT RECENTLY HAS INCLUDED A DISPATCHER AS PART OF THAT TEAM. THE HOPE IS THAT AS TIME CONTINUES, THESE TEAMS WILL WORK EVEN MORE EFFICIENTLY WITH ONE ANOTHER AND TOWARDS A GOAL OF COOPERATION, AND SHARING TASKS. THIS SHOULD BUILD MORE SENSE OF OWNERSHIP AND RESPONSIBILITY TO THE TEAM AS A WHOLE AS WELL AS EACH MEMBER. CURRENTLY, THERE ARE FOUR SUCH TEAMS AND THREE OF THEM HAVE A SERGEANT ASSIGNED TO THE TEAM. WITH THE TEAMS WORKING 12 HOURS SHIFTS THEY ARE ABLE TO COVER A LOT OF THEIR OWN VACATION OR SICKNESS SHORTAGES WITHOUT THE COST OF OVERTIME. AS THIS MAY CONTINUE INTO 2018, MORE RESULTS MAY BE KNOWN LATER.
- MEANWHILE, CONTINUED EDUCATION OF ALL OF OUR STAFF IS ONGOING AND KEEPING UP WITH THEIR INTERESTS OR DESIRES CAN SERVE TO BE CHALLENGING BUT EVER NECESSARY.

THEY ARE HARDWORKING AND DEDICATED INDIVIDUALS WHO WANT TO PROVIDE THE BEST SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY AND OUR SUBSCRIBER AGENCIES. I AM PROUD TO CALL THEM MY COWORKERS.

SEASIDE'S DISPATCH CENTER IS BUDGETED FOR A STAFF OF EIGHT. WE NOT ONLY PERFORM THE TASKS OF 9-1-1 AND POLICE/FIRE DISPATCH, BUT ALSO AGENCY RECEPTIONIST, RECORDS AND EVIDENCE MANAGEMENT. OUR SERVICE POPULATION IS APPROXIMATELY 30,000 PEOPLE. WE PRIMARILY DISPATCH FOR:




