### **SEASIDE AIRPORT COMMITTEE**

The purpose of the Seaside Airport Committee is to act as an advisory body to the City Council, the City Manager, and the Public Works Director/City Engineer regarding issues concerning the Seaside Public Airport.

The committee consist of the following permanent members: the Public Works Director/City Engineer (or designee), a member of the Seaside City Council, a member of the Gearhart City Council, and six (6) non-permanent citizen members, who are not employees of the City, and at least four (4) of the non-permanent citizens shall reside within the City limits who shall serve as members-at-large.

The citizen members of the committee shall be selected from, but are not limited to, members of the following groups: persons with a demonstrated interest in public airport, educators, private businesspersons, persons with a diversity of ethnic and cultural affiliations, and persons of diverse economic backgrounds and interests.

The members shall serve without salary or compensation of any nature.

All members shall be appointed by the City Council and shall serve for a term of three years. However, three of the first non-permanent members shall be appointed for a term of one year, two years, and three years respectively. As those terms expire, the vacancy will be filled for three-year terms in each case.

Each year, at the first Committee meeting in January, the members shall appoint one of their members as Chairperson and one as Vice-Chairperson. One of the Committee members will serve as Secretary. Minutes of all meetings will be filed with the City Council.

The Committee shall hold a regular meeting at least once each month of the calendar year. The meetings shall be open to the public. Any person appointed by the City Council to serve on this committee who misses three or more regularly scheduled meetings during a 12 month period shall be notified by letter that the position must be vacated. The individual may appeal the decision to the City Council. (A 12 month period is defined as beginning in January of each calendar year.)



At their regular City Council meeting held January 22, 2018, the Council approved Resolution #3909, which set a date for a public hearing on February 26, 2018 March 12, 2018, 7:00 PM, in the Council Chambers at City Hall, 989 Broadway, Seaside. The purpose of the hearing is to take public testimony concerning the Avenue 'H' Local Improvement District (LID) Project.

(The Ordinance that will be presented at the City Council meeting required a meets and bounds description which the City of Seaside hires out for survey work. The initial public hearing was to be held February 26, 2018, and has been rescheduled for March12, 2018, to allow time to prepare the ordinance.)

The Avenue 'H' Local Improvement District Project consists of installing new Storm drainage Catch Basins and piping, reconstruction of the existing road bed and Asphalt Paving the roadway on Avenue H between King Street and the Railroad Park. The new Asphalt Paved Street will be approximately 20 feet wide and 250 feet in length. With the adoption of the City's Transportation System Plan (TSP) and because this is a low speed, non-connective street, and because there are no other streets within the Bradbury's Addition subdivision that have Tcurbs and sidewalks, the TSP will allow us to adopt the smaller footprint road standard to fit existing neighborhood aesthetics. The engineer's estimate for this project is under \$30,000 and there are 5 owners and 7 tax lots that either front the project or have access directly to the project area.

In conjunction with this project is a City project along King Street and Avenue I. This project extends the Storm Drainage from Avenue H, and continues the storm drainage down King Street to Avenue I and turns to include the intersection of South Lincoln. In addition, a new Waterline will be installed in order to upgrade the old Galvanized Steel Pipe. The roadway will then receive an Asphalt Overlay. The engineer's estimate for this project is under \$65,000.

Enclosed is Resolution #3909, maps of the proposed LID area, and information regarding the <u>estimated</u> costs of the project.

All interested persons are invited to attend the meeting and submit oral testimony in favor of or in opposition to the proposal, or to ask any questions regarding the Avenue 'H' LID. Written testimony is also welcome but should be submitted to Seaside City Hall, 989 Broadway, Seaside, Oregon 97138, by 5:00 PM, Wednesday, March 7, 2018, to be included with the information provided to the City Council.

### ORDINANCE NO. 2018-04

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF CERTAIN PROPERTIES IN THE CITY OF SEASIDE, OREGON, BY INSTALLING NEW STORM DRAINAGE CATCH BASINS AND PIPING, RECONSTRUCTION OF EXISTING ROAD BED AND ASPHALT PAVING THE ROADWAY AS REQUIRED BY CITY STANDARDS ON AVENUE 'H' BETWEEN KING STREET AND RAILROAD PARK

# THE CITY OF SEASIDE ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to Resolution #3909, the improvement described as, The Avenue 'H' Local Improvement District Project consists of installing new Storm drainage Catch Basins and piping, reconstruction of the existing road bed and Asphalt Paving the roadway on Avenue H between King Street and the Railroad Park. The new Asphalt Paved Street will be approximately 20 feet wide and 250 feet in length. With the adoption of the City's Transportation System Plan (TSP) and because this is a low speed, non-connective street, and because there are no other streets within the Bradbury's Addition subdivision that have curbs and sidewalks, the TSP will allow us to adopt the smaller footprint road standard to fit existing neighborhood aesthetics. The engineer's estimate for this project is under \$30,000 and there are 5 owners and 7 tax lots that either front the project or have access directly to the project area. In conjunction with this project is a City project along King Street and Avenue I. This project extends the Storm Drainage from Avenue H, and continues the storm drainage down King Street to Avenue I and turns to include the intersection of South Lincoln. In addition, a new Waterline will be installed in order to upgrade the old Galvanized Steel Pipe. The roadway will then receive an Asphalt Overlay. The engineer's estimate for this project is under \$65,000. These improvements will be to required City Standards, is hereby ordered completed in conformity and as accepted by the City Council.

SECTION 2. A parcel of land located in the northeast one-quarter of the southeast one-quarter of Section 21, Township 6 North, Range 10 West of the Willamette Meridian in the City of Seaside, Clatsop County, Oregon, described specifically as follows: Beginning at the northwest corner of Lot 9, Block 1 of the plat of "Bradbury's Addition to Ocean Grove", recorded May 9, 1889 in Book "O", Page 39, Clatsop County Plat Records; thence, from said point of beginning, East, along the north lines Lots 3, 5, and 9, all of Block 1 of said plat, a distance of 215.25 feet, more or less to the northeast corner said Lot 3, which is also a point on the west right-of-way line of South King Street; thence, South, along said west right-ofway line, a distance of 180.00 feet, more or less to the southeast corner of Lot 1, Block 2 of said plat; thence, West, along the south line of said Lot 1, a distance of 100.00 feet, more or less to the southwest corner of thereof, said point also being on the east line of Lot 6, Block 2 of said plat; thence, South, along the east line of said Lot 6, a distance of 50.00 feet, more or less to the southeast corner thereof; thence, West, along the south lines of Lots 6, 7, and 11, all of Block 2 of said plat, a distance of 176.00 feet, more or less to the southwest corner of said Lot 11, which is also a point on the easterly right-of-way line of Irvine Place, said right-of-way now being a portion of Railroad Park; thence, Northeasterly, along a portion of said easterly right-of-way line and a portion of the east right-of-way line of Irvine Place as vacated in Book 917, Page 27, Clatsop County Deed Records, a distance of 237.89 feet more or less to the point of beginning. All being located within the City of Seaside, County of Clatsop, State of Oregon.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> The estimated assessments against the properties benefited shall be charges and liens against the property. The City may enforce collection of such assessments as provided by state law.

SECTION 4. The Council may adopt, correct, modify or revise the proposed assessments or estimated assessments to be charged against each lot within the district, according to the special and particular benefits accruing thereto from the improvements and shall by ordinance spread the assessments. The estimated assessment lien shall continue until the time the estimated assessments become a final assessment.

SECTION 5. Directing the City Manager to have detailed plans and specifications of the local improvement prepared and that, when appropriate, the City invite bids for construction of the local improvement.

SECTION 6. The Council may accept or reject any and all bids submitted.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> That after duly considering the Engineer's estimated assessments, it is hereby established that the assessments for the improvements may be paid as follows:

Cash within ten (10) days of notice of final assessment, or payments over a twenty year period in forty semi-annual installments to the City, with interest at six percent (6%).

The amount of each installment (percentage of the total final assessment) shall be determined by the city and shall be as appears by the bond lien docket described in state law (O.R.S. 223.230). Each installment shall be due and payable with the accrued and unpaid interest on the unpaid balance of the final assessment amount at the rate per annum determined by the city.

### **RESOLUTION #3909**

A RESOLUTION OF INTENT TO IMPROVE CERTAIN PROPERTIES IN THE CITY OF SEASIDE, OREGON, BY IMPROVING PORTIONS OF AVENUE H BETWEEN KING STREET AND THE RAILROAD PARK TO REQUIRED CITY STANDARDS

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Seaside, Oregon, has received a petition from the property owners abutting portions of Avenue H between King Street and the Railroad Park.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEASIDE:

SECTION 1. The boundaries of the proposed local improvement district are those properties, which abut portions of Avenue H between King Street and Railroad Park. (See attached map and legal description)

**SECTION 2.** The method of apportioning the estimated assessment of the local improvement among the property owners shall be by property owner.

**SECTION 3.** That such portion of the final assessments, which are assessed to the property owners shall be a charge and lien upon properties benefited.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> That the Charter of the City of Seaside and Chapter 33 of the City of Seaside Code of Ordinances are hereby made a part of this resolution.

SECTION 5. Costs associated with the performance of the improvement shall bear interest not to exceed six percent (6%) per annum and shall constitute general obligations of the City of Seaside.

**SECTION 6.** Unless those persons representing at least 66 2/3 percent of the proposed estimated assessment within said local improvement district file with the City Recorder a written objection and remonstrance against such proposed local improvement district prior to the public hearing or present their written or oral objections at the public hearing, the Council shall be deemed to have acquired jurisdiction to order the information of the local improvement district to conform in all particulars to the plans and specifications previously adopted. Any such objection or remonstrance shall state the objections and grounds for such objection or remonstrance.

SECTION 7. A public hearing on the proposed improvement shall be held on February 26, 2018, at 7:00 PM, at the regular meeting of the Council, in the Council Chambers, 989 Broadway, Seaside, Oregon 97138.

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
