## 2021 END OF YEAR REPORT



# A WORD FROM THE CHIEF

The Seaside Police Department during 2021 operated with the COVID-19 pandemic continuing. Most of our services offered were operational with some limitations. Our lobby remained closed with the exception of some short in person business occurring within the building, while maintaining social distancing and mask use. Our patrol operations continued with little negative impact to our community.

In 2021 we had most of our positions filled with the exception of one patrol officer and our community service officer, which were filled in June of 2021. We were excited to hire Officer Jason Johnson and Community Service Officer Paul Knoch. With their additions our team finished the year fully staffed. Officer Johnson attended the basic police academy, with a couple of interruptions in the training due to COVID-19 cases at the academy, but he did complete the academy and went into field training that continued into the spring of 2022. CSO Knoch has been doing a great job with his position and he has taken on a role of as a homeless liaison, working closely with the members of our community who are unhoused and experiencing homelessness, in addition to his other assignments as the code enforcement officer, parking enforcement and animal control.

I had the privilege to promote two officers, Evan Edwards and Justin Gagnon, to the rank of corporal. They both met the time in service and along with other requirements have shown their leadership ability within the department.

### A WORD FROM THE CHIEF CONT'D

OUR COMMUNICATIONS DIVISION HAD SOME MAJOR CHANGES IN 2021. DUE TO THE ASTORIA COMMUNICATIONS CENTER EXPERIENCING A CRITICALLY LOW LEVEL OF STAFFING, INCLUDING A VACANT COMMUNICATIONS MANAGER POSITION FOR A GREAT DEAL OF 2021. OUR COMMUNICATIONS MANAGER, MITCH BROWN, HAD BEEN SERVING PART TIME AS THEIR ACTING MANAGER FOR THE PAST YEAR AND A HALF UNTIL APD HIRED THEIR OWN MANAGER IN AUGUST OF 2021. ADDITIONAL STAFFING SHORTAGES WITHIN THE APD COMMUNICATIONS CENTER CAUSED A CRITICAL COMMUNICATIONS PROBLEM FOR THEM. WORKING COLLABORATIVELY WITH THE CITY OF ASTORIA AN AGREEMENT WITH CITY OF SEASIDE BEGAN WHERE THE SEASIDE COMMUNICATIONS CENTER HOSTED A TEMPORARY MERGED COMMUNICATIONS CENTER. ASTORIA DISPATCHERS MOVED INTO THE SEASIDE CENTER IN NOVEMBER OF 2021. ALTHOUGH THEIR STAFFING IS NOT AT THE LEVEL THEY WOULD LIKE TO BE, WITH SEASIDE'S HELP THEY ARE PREPARING TO MOVE BACK VERY SOON TO THE ASTORIA COMMUNICATIONS CENTER BY THE END OF MAY 2022. THIS TEMPORARY MERGE OF THE TWO CENTERS CREATED MANY CHALLENGES FOR THE STAFF OF BOTH CENTERS, INCLUDING SOME INFRASTRUCTURE DEFICIENCIES THAT A CONSOLIDATED DISPATCH CENTER CREATES. WE CONTINUE TO WORK THROUGH THE CHALLENGES AND ALTHOUGH AT TIMES SOME OF THE RADIO COMMUNICATIONS WERE POOR AROUND THE COUNTY, THE SERVICE TO OUR COMMUNITY WAS A TOP PRIORITY AND THE PUBLIC SAFETY EXPECTATIONS WERE MET, IF NOT EXCEEDED.

AS 2022 CONTINUES WE ARE PLANNING AND PREPARING FOR A BUSY SUMMER SEASON. THE SEASIDE POLICE DEPARTMENT HAS THE TRAINED STAFF IN OUR DETECTIVE, PATROL AND COMMUNICATION DIVISIONS THAT OUR RESIDENTS AND VISITORS HAVE COME TO DEPEND ON AS WE PROVIDE THE COMMUNITY WITH SAFETY AND SECURITY THROUGH THE HIGHEST LEVEL OF PROFESSIONAL, ETHICAL AND INTEGRITY BASED SERVICES.


